

Cornwall Councillor Report – St Austell Bay Parish Council – July 2026

I hope you are all well as we head through July.

I thought I would provide a report for July, even though you aren't having a meeting this month, as I won't be at your meeting in August or providing a report as I will be on holiday.

Cormac have now completely finished their works at Porthpean Beach, meaning all the rubble has been removed, the minor patching works have been completed and all equipment taken off site.

I continue to chase Cormac regarding putting the DYL back on Duporth Road.

Their latest response was as follows:

'With regard to Duporth Road, we appreciate the frustration caused by the advance warning signs remaining in place while there has been a delay to the lining works. Unfortunately, our lining subcontractor has experienced programme delays, and we have been actively chasing them to secure a date for completion.'

We fully recognise the importance of reinstating the double yellow lines on Duporth Road and Ridgewood Close, together with the virtual pavement markings, particularly given the seasonal parking pressures in the area. These remain a priority, and we are continuing to press our contractor to complete the works at the earliest opportunity.'

Thank you for your patience.'

I hope they will do this as soon as possible, as it beggars belief that they installed these lines in time for the summer season before going over them and not putting them back again before the season properly starts!

They do appear to have done the ones at Ridgewood Close though, which is now complete in terms of this work.

It's been great to see the building momentum nationally of the campaign to support our coastguards as the MCA proposes to remove their remuneration and make their roles into fully voluntary ones.

When I submitted my cross party motion calling on Cornwall Council to support our local coastguards and for the Leader of Cornwall Council Leigh Frost Cornwall Councillor for Bodmin St Petroc to be mandated to write to the Secretary of State in opposition to these changes, I was blown away by the support I received from councillors from across the chamber, ahead of the Full Council meeting on 21st July where this would have been debated.

However I was also conscious that this was a very fast moving situation as the Government was looking to bring these proposals in after the summer, I wanted to ensure Cornwall Council set out its position as soon as possible.

When I first submitted my motion I also wrote about the Government's propensity to change its mind on tough decisions - I wasn't anticipating that they would dump their Prime Minister though, which will probably also lead to a ripple effect of Ministers changing throughout the Government over the next few months, further disrupting any negotiations on this critical issue.

So with this in mind, I have been in discussion with Cllr Frost about the best way to process this. Leigh is supportive of my motion, having already written to the MCA with his concerns shortly after I submitted it, and given the overwhelming support from councillors prior to the meeting in July, we decided the best thing to do, in order to progress this now, is for Cllr Frost to adopt the content of the motion and write in advance of Full Council, which he has now done.

I am grateful to Leigh for his support and understanding of this massive issue for coastal communities across Cornwall, and am pleased that he has been able to act pragmatically and accomplish the goal of my motion several weeks earlier than I originally anticipated.

I hope the Government will listen to the voices from Cornwall, and across the country, and come to a workable outcome that does endanger the continued operation of our Coastguards.

We await their response.
